This one – day event is divided into four major activities - Bird watching, monitoring and field trip, clean up drive for birds and sanitation, exhibit on bird migration in the community, and the conduct of "Dalaw Turo" (*Dalaw* – to visit; *Turo* – to teach). Coordination activities to the local officials, school principal, and other volunteers prior to the conduct of activities shall also be done.

a) For bird watching, monitoring and field trip, the lush naturally growing mangrove forest in Batan

Mariculture Station of the University of the Philippines in Brgy. Camaligan, Batan, Aklan is an ideal place. The educational trip will last up to one (1) hour only.

- b) Simultaneous with the bird watching, monitoring and field trip, the Clean Up drive will utilize the local residents to pick up all plastics and residuals along the wetlands where most of the migratory birds are observed.
- c) Exhibit of artworks and posters on bird migration and plastic pollution will be installed in the Barangay Hall of Camaligan, Batan, Aklan in the morning for viewing to all residents and guests coming to the said barangay, and inside the Camaligan National High School in the afternoon for the students, parents, and teachers' appreciation.
- d) A team from the PENRO Aklan will be performing the Dalaw Turo with the parents, teachers, and students of Camaligan National High School. Dalaw Turo will have the mind setting, a street theatre/drama on biodiversity conservation, and environmental games.

The celebration of WMBD 2019 through the Migrasyon at Polusyon (English: "Migration and Pollution"): An Outdoor Learning Event for Bird Migration and Plastic Pollution is indeed a successful one due to a big

number of participants gathered than what was expected. A total of 165 individuals participated in the said learning event. The activities under WMBD 2019 in Brgy. Camaligan, Batan, Aklan on May 11, 2019 were facilitated by Mr. Aren J. Rubin, Public Information Officer of PENRO – Aklan, together with the staff of Protected Area Management and Biodiversity Conservation Unit. Hereunder are the brief discussion on the activities conducted:

# 1. Bird Watching, Monitoring and Field Trip:

About 14 individuals comprised of some members of the Camaligan Barangay Council and volunteers were formed as group to participate in bird watching, monitoring, and field trip. This activity was done from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 a.m. Through the use of binoculars, they were taught to identify the proper names of migratory birds and other wildlife forms found in the wetlands of Batan Mariculture Station. Some of the birds identified were wandering whistling ducks, herons, egrets, terns, and stilt. Under this activity, the barangay council committed to pass a resolution to the local government unit of Batan, Aklan to pass an ordinance to provide support in the conservation and protection of migratory birds and other wildlife found in the locality of Brgy. Camaligan, Batan, Aklan.

## 2. Clean Up Drive for Birds and Sanitation

Simultaneous with the bird watching, another group composed of 74 local residents were mobilized to do the clean up of plastic wastes in the water bodies of Brgy. Camaligan, Batan, Aklan brought by the waves of the open sea. About 16 sacks and garbage bags of plastics were collected by the residents and brought to the materials recovery facility (MRF) of the barangay for proper disposition. Upon learning such volume of waste collected for an hour only, the barangay officials intended to request the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) to conduct intensive communication, education and public awareness on proper solid waste management in their locality.

### 3. Exhibit of artworks and posters for bird migration

Different posters were exhibited in the barangay hall of Brgy. Camaligan, Batan, Aklan visible enough to all clients coming in and out of the hall. There are also volunteers who also shared their artworks on bird protection during the WMBD celebration. While in the afternoon session, these artworks and posters were showcased in Camaligan National High School for the appreciation of teachers, students, and parents.

## 4. Dalaw Turo

Dalaw (to visit) Turo (to teach) is the highlight among the activities set for WMBD 2019. The Dalaw Turo was done at 1:30 o'clock in the afternoon of May 11, 2019. This is an alternative approach to spread awareness on biodiversity conservation. Among its sub-activities include mind setting, environmental skit or drama, and environmental games such as for solid waste management, forest protection, and interrelatedness. About 77 individuals comprised of students, teachers, and parents of Camaligan National High School participated in this activity. Positive responses from the school were noted by the facilitators, in fact, the said school requested the facilitator to repeat the same activity for other students and parents who weren't able to attend the Dalaw Turo.
