Forest Department of Rakhine State, Nature Conservation Society-Myanmar (NCS) and local partner Rakhine Biodiversity and Nature Conservation Association (RBANCA) are together celebrated WMBD at Nanthar Island and Mayyu estuary Ramsar site in Myanmar. The site was designated as Flyway Network Site in 2018 and Ramsar Site in 2020. The site is supporting 5% global population of critically endangered Spoon-billed Sandpiper and other threatened shorebirds includes seaturtles.

On the 8-9 October 2021, RBANCA team members and local forest department staff are installed four signboards (Height 3' x Length 6') about Spoon-billed Sandpiper and other globally threatened species which are fully protection with Conservation of Biodiversity and Protected Areas Law (2018) Myanmar. One signboards was installed at the Island and another three signboards at (Angu Maw, Man Kyi Chaung and Kone Dan villages near by Ramsar Site). On that days, the team members are distributed (Height 3' x Length 2') Spoon-billed Sandpiper information small posters to villagers and tagged at the glory shops, markets and tea shops where many people are visiting places. Moreover, handover five manual disinfected spray pumps for protection of the COVID-19 virus disease at the villages. When distribution the posters to villagers, the team members explained World Migratory Bird Day event and why importance for conservation of migratory water birds.

On 10th October 2021, RBANCA team conducted the winter count at the Nanthar Island. Recorded total numbers 668 waterbird includes globally threatened species (5) Lesser Adjutant Stock (VU), (12) Black-headed Ibis (NT) and (47) Eurasian Curlew (NT). The critically endangered Spoon-billed Sandpiper is not arrived during the count period. Below is the list of count.
