**Section 3. SHORT SUMMARY REPORT**

Kamrun Nahar Jeny, representing Nature Eye, kicked off the event with warm greetings all participants, providing a brief introduction to the festivities of World Migratory Bird Day. The event commenced with a few welcoming remarks by Headmaster Md. Saiful Islam of Bandar Tila Government Primary School. Following the inauguration, participants were shown documentary video on migratory waterbirds of Nijhum Dweep National Park in Bangladesh.

Kamrun Nahar Jeny delved into the current status of migratory waterbirds at Nijhum Dweep National Park. She underscored the park's significance as an EAAFP Flyway Network Site, emphasizing its role as a crucial habitat for globally threatened waterbird

species such as the Spoon-billed Sandpiper, Asian Dowitcher, Great Knot, Spotted Greenshank, and Indian Skimmer. Participants also acquired knowledge about the role of wetlands in supporting migratory waterbirds and learned about various conservation strategies for wetland protection.

Subsequent to that session, distributed informational leaflets to participants, enlightening them about migratory waterbirds and the laws preventing bird hunting, and handed out the EAAFP-produced print poster featuring the theme of World Migratory Bird Day 2023. Following this, students enthusiastically participated in an art competition centered around migratory birds and their habitats.

The conclusion of World Migratory Bird Day featured Kamrun Nahar Jeny providing a summary of the event's outcomes. Subsequently, the winners of the Art Competition were duly rewarded.

At the end of the program, the Headmaster of school expressed gratitude to Nature Eye and EAAFP for the successful organization of the WMBD events, which significantly enhanced participants' understanding of migratory waterbirds, their habitats, and contributed to the improved protection of migratory birds and their non-breeding grounds at Nijhum Dweep National Park, recognized as an EAAFP site for migratory waterbirds.
