Insects play a crucial role in maintaining ecosystem balance, including as a primary food source for birds in the surrounding environment. However, the excessive use of chemical pesticides by farmers has become a serious issue in insect conservation, which in turn can disrupt the natural food chain, especially for bird populations. On the other hand, birds are integral parts of the ecosystem and play a role in controlling insect populations, maintaining ecosystem balance, and dispersing plant seeds. The presence of these birds is highly dependent on the availability of food, where insects are their main food source.

Therefore, it is necessary to conduct socialization on the use of chemical pesticides for farmers with an approach that considers insect conservation as the primary food source for birds. This socialization aims to enhance farmers' understanding of the importance of preserving insect diversity and reducing excessive or harmful use of chemical pesticides for the ecosystem.

Therefore, concrete steps supporting insect conservation as the primary food source for birds need to be encouraged, including the use of environmentally friendly alternative pesticides, sustainable farming practices, and the promotion of more integrated farming practices with local biodiversity.

Event Objectives:

1. Raising Awareness Among Farmers
Building awareness among farmers about the importance of insect conservation as the primary food source for birds and the negative impacts of excessive use of chemical pesticides on the ecosystem.
2. Reducing the Use of Chemical Pesticides
Educating farmers about more environmentally friendly farming practices and wiser pesticide use, focusing on reducing the use of chemical pesticides that may harm insect populations.
3. Encouraging Sustainable Farming Practices
Promoting the adoption of sustainable farming practices that consider ecosystem balance and the sustainability of natural resources, including the use of more natural pest control methods and reducing reliance on chemical pesticides.
4. Enhancing Ecosystem Balance
Taking concrete steps to support insect conservation as a vital part of the food chain and overall ecosystem balance.
5. Promoting Collaboration
Encouraging collaboration among farmers, government authorities, environmental organizations, and conservation experts to create holistic and sustainable solutions in maintaining biodiversity and agricultural sustainability

Plan Activity:**Education and Workshop Sessions**

- Organizing education and workshop sessions for farmers in the agricultural areas of Mibo Village, Banda Raya District, Banda Aceh City.
- Presenting information about the crucial role of insects in the ecosystem and as a food source for birds.
- Educating about the negative impacts of excessive use of chemical pesticides on insect populations and the overall ecosystem.
- Introducing alternative pest control methods that are environmentally friendly.

Development of Educational Materials

- Developing educational materials such as pamphlets, brochures, and short videos that can be used as sources of information for farmers.
- Ensuring that the educational materials are easy to understand, engaging, and relevant to the local agricultural context.

Outcome:

- 50 farmers from Mibo Village, Banda Aceh City have a better understanding of the crucial role of insects in agricultural ecosystems and as a food source for birds.
- It is expected that there will be a decrease in the excessive and uncontrolled use of chemical pesticides as farmers transition to more natural and environmentally friendly pest control methods.
- Closer cooperation is established between farmers, government authorities, environmental organizations, and conservation experts in supporting sustainable farming practices.
- Through the adoption of sustainable farming practices, it is hoped that farmers will also gain long-term economic benefits through increased productivity and the sustainability of their agricultural ventures.
